

REPORT TO COUNCIL Ordinary Council Meeting (28/09/2021)

AREA: Works

TOWN WORKS

- Town crew over the month have worked at the landfill sorting waste incorrectly dumped, drainage maintenance, verge mowing. Extensive tree pruning around Norseman.
- Town crew pumping sewer water to reduce volumes in storage ponds.

GARDEN CREW

- Final remaining garden crew member has resigned, issues he refused to sign onto the SAFE WA register. Staff member was sent home.
- Letter sent to employee requesting information on the status of his employment. The staff member dropped off his written resignation stating the cause being that the Shire was forcing him to get vaccinated.
 - All discussions with staff were this may possibly happen but not as yet, but all staff were required to sign onto the SAFE WA register.

ROAD CREW

 Road crew conducting small amounts of Private works delivering material to the camp and sewer site construction.

HYDEN-NORSEMAN ROAD

- Minor patching completed on the Hyden Norseman Road, closed several times in the month due to rain and excessive rain at Forrestonia.
- Road has sand holes appearing over 30 km distance from Shire boundary, road recently graded by the mine grading contractor.

BUILDING MAINTENANCE

Report being created on Shire buildings.

PLANT MAINTENANCE

- Commenced replacement of Cat 910 K loader quote period closed all 9 applications and 3 Auction house offers being correlated.
- Companies that have sent in quotes for the replacement loader are, Hitachi, Case, Komatsu, John Deere, SDLG, Volvo, Caterpillar.
- With Auction houses, Pickles, Smith Broughton, and Manheim.
- Preferred loader to replace the CAT 910 K loader is the 444 P John Deere.
- SMALL PLANT, new whipper snippers and lawn mowers have been purchased, all are battery operated, reducing the requirement for fuel to be stored at the depot. Items were required urgently as almost all current plant was not working or required extensive repairs.

CEMETERY

- Sourcing correct grave site numbering plaques.
- Progressing the new section of the cemetery with obtaining approvals from Government departments.

Work Health and Safety Bushfire Brigades and Volunteers Presentation

The Shire President, CEO, Manager for Works and Services, Manager for Corporate and Community Services, and the Bushfire Risk and Planning Coordinator recently attend a combined WALGA and LGIS presentation on Work Health and Safety requirements and considerations for volunteers working on Bushfire Brigades.

Key points for the Shire are:

• Shire Senior Officers are considered a Person Conducting a Business or Undertaking (PBCU). A PBCU must ensure, as far is reasonably practicable, the health and safety of workers engaged, or



caused to be engaged, by the PBCU, and workers whose activities are influenced or directed by the PBCU. This includes volunteer workers.

- WHS requirements relates to work environment, plant and structures, systems, handling and storage of plant and equipment.
- Provision of facilities for:
 - welfare
 - information
 - training
 - o instruction and supervision, and
 - o monitoring conditions
 - o This also includes accommodation provided by the PBCU.

Elected Members are not considered as Officers, workers or PBCU under the WHS Act, however they may be considered as another under section 29 of the Act, **duty of other persons at a workplace:**


