Summary

For the Council to consider the review of the Shire of Dundas Town Planning Scheme No 2

Background

Members will recall that a report relating to the review of the Town Planning Scheme No 2 was prepared for consideration at the Ordinary meeting of the Council held in November 2017. The Council resolved the following:



That the Shire of Dundas prepare a scheme review report on the Shire of Dundas Town Planning Scheme No 2 with the view to undertaking a scheme amendment to bring the scheme into conformity with the Planning and Development (Local Planning Scheme) Regulations 2015.

The Planning and Development (Local Planning Scheme) Regulations 2015 requires that the scheme be reviewed at least every 5 years and that requirement is currently due. Following the review the Shire is to prepare a report to submit its findings to the WA Planning Commission with recommendations as to whether the scheme is satisfactory, should be amended or a new scheme be prepared

Statutory Environment

Policy Implications

The TPS enables the Council to implement policies for specific development or strategies that are considered appropriate.

Financial Implications

The cost of undertaking a review or an amendment to the TPS can vary considerably depending on the complexity of the Scheme and the scope of the works to be undertaken. The project could not realistically be undertaken in house due to the complexity of the process and technical requirements of the WA Planning Commission.

Preliminary discussions with planning consultants indicate that a simple preparation of a scheme amendment with a new scheme text, preparation of advertising materials and lodgement to the WA Planning Commission would be around \$15K. It would be necessary to include additional costs for consultation, advertising, printing and the like.

There is currently no provision in the 2017/18 budget to undertake the necessary work.

The preparation of the scheme report was undertaken with current resources.

Strategic Implications

During the process of the review of the Town Planning Scheme, the planning consultant will need to take into consideration and include or remove provisions that meet or conflict with the Community Strategic Plan.

Comment

Discussions with planning consultants indicate that the Shires planning scheme requirements could possibly be accommodated with an "omnibus amendment" which would in effect bring the existing Scheme into conformity with the Model Scheme Text contained within the Planning and Development (Local Planning Scheme) Regulations 2015.

The alternative is a full scheme review process and the Shire would end up with a new Local Planning Scheme and Scheme Report. This would be based on the full Model Scheme with negotiated local variations.

The Shire needs to provide the WAPC with a scheme review report with a recommendation as to whether the scheme is:



- · satisfactory in its existing form; or
- · should be amended; or
- should be repealed and a new scheme prepared in its place.

A scheme report has been prepared with a recommendation to the WAPC that the scheme should be amended. A copy of the scheme report is included in the papers relating

Summary

For the Council of the Shire of Dundas to consider and approve the draft Agreement with the Minister of Works agreeing to permit the Shire of Dundas to access the property identified in reserve 5655 for the purpose of accessing water.

Background

The project consultants of the airport upgrade project have advised that it is not feasible to use salt water in the final stages of construction as there is too much risk of damaging the final bitumen seal and that fresh water is therefore essential.

The estimated volume of fresh water requirement is 6,000 kl over next three to four months.



Statutory Environment

Under the section 9.49A of the Local Government Act 1995, the common seal cannot be affixed to an agreement without initiated by a Council resolution.

The Shire's Strategic Plans include the upgrade of the Norseman airstrip as an all-weather access airstrip to manage emergency services.

Comment

The project has dragged on and is over time and over budget due to many reasons. Hence, the Shire is not in a position at this time to spend a significant amount of money to source water required for the project. This has prompted the Shire to look for alternative sources of fresh water virtually at zero cost.

The Shire is planning to meet the water requirement of this project sourcing water from the Tin Dam (12km from the construction site) and Wingarnie Rocks Dam commonly known as Pioneer Dam situated 43km north of the town.

Department of Water and Environmental Regulation and CNGC have already provided their approvals to access water from Tin Dam.

Management order of the Wingarnie Rocks Dam sits with the Department of Finance (Minister for Works) and the department requires the Shire to enter in to a Licence to Access and Indemnity agreement with them to permit the Shire to access the property identified in reserve 5655 for the purpose of accessing water.

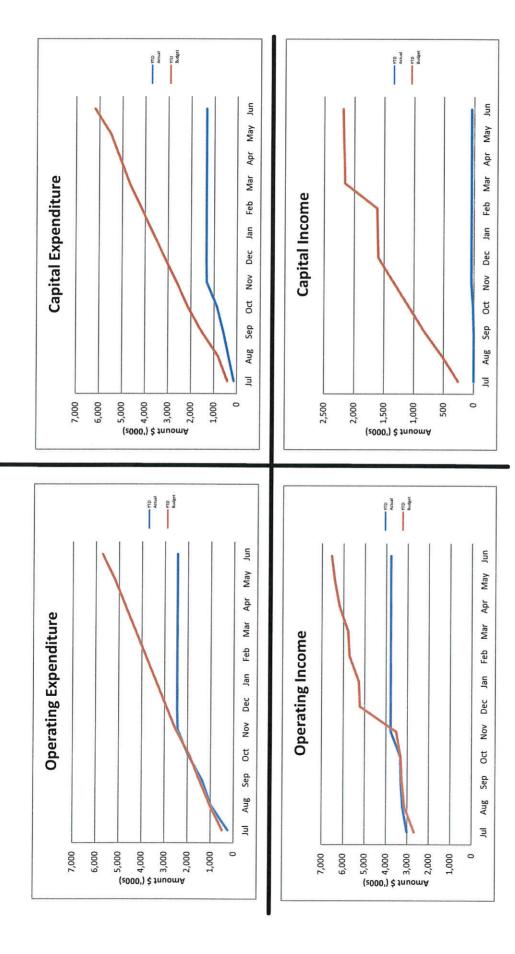

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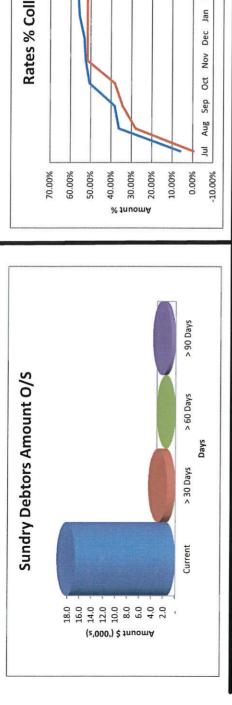
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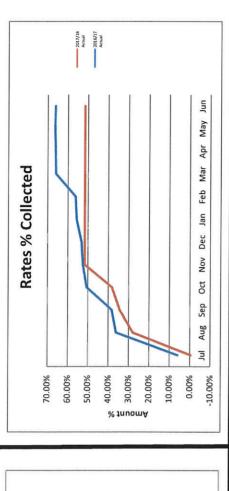
Income and Expenditure Graphs for the Perod 01 July 2016 to 30 November 2017

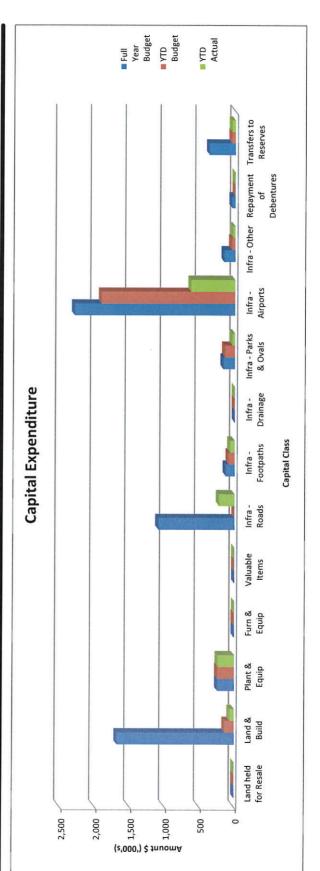

Reserve 5655 is currently under a Management Order with the Department of Finance. This reserve is extended across two shires, the Shire of Dundas and the Shire of Coolgardie.

Wingarnie Rocks Dam (commonly known as Pioneer Dam) situated in the section of the reserve, falls within the boundary of the Shire of Dundas.

Water is collected in a granite outcrop and piped into the dam. Presumably this was used in operating steam trains between Kalgoorlie and Esperance.
