Dear Jon,

Further to our meetings and conversations, could you please assist Central Norseman Gold Corporation (CNGC) and myself in relation to accessing the water collected in the Old Tin Dam, which was the previous water supply to the Norseman township prior to the new water facilities established in town. CNGC needs to have access to storm water (rain water fresh) for their processing plant. CNGC are looking to increase their throughput and need to have access to good quality and higher fresh water usage to assist in their gold recoveries and stripping circuits. Further, good quality water also assists in the production of our cyanide and lime usage, which we are addressing through obtaining higher quality water from various sources and blending of water quality can assist this matter as well.

The Old Tin Dam holds approximately 13.5 million litres of water when full and has a contouring system in place from the surrounding hills and terrain for catchment purposes, and has a pumping station within the compound for pumping and transferring water. We envisage of pumping and transferring this water to our transfer station at the tails dam and via the pipeline already in place back to the processing plant.

The dam will require some remedial sealing as it appears that the cracks of the upper levels of the concrete which is allowing the water to escape. However, in monitoring it appears to be holding at around the half way full level (approx. 4-5million litres).

The Tin Dam is currently on CNGC's mining lease, within approximately 3kms of our TS4 Tailings Dam.

Jon, could you please advise if there are any issues and with the Shire's support in accessing this water for the Phoenix Plant processing requirements.

On behalf of the CNGC and management, I would like to thank you and the CEO as well as council members for the support and assisting in our operational requirements in relation to water matters road accesses and etc.





Freedom of information procedures & access arrangements

Access to information

Applications will be acknowledged in writing and you will be notified of the decision within 45 days.

Access arrangements

Access to documents can be granted by way of inspection, a copy of a document, a copy of an audio or video tape, a computer disk, a transcript of a recorded, shorthand or encoded document from which words can be reproduced.

Notice of decision

As soon as possible but in any case within 45 days you will be provided with a notice of decision which will include details such as –

- the date which the decision was made
- the name and the designation of the officer who made the decision
- if the document is an exempt document the reasons for classifying the matter exempt; or the fact that access is given to an edited document
- information on the right to review and the procedures to be followed to exercise those rights

Refusal of access

Applicants who are dissatisfied with a decision of the Shire of Dundas are entitled to ask for an **internal review** by the Shire.

Application should be made in writing within 30 days of receiving the notice of decision.

You will be notified of the outcome of the review within 15 days.

If you disagree with the result you then can apply to the Information Commissioner for an **external review**, and details would be advised to applicants when the internal review decision is issued.

External review rights

If you are not satisfied with the internal review decision, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner seeking external review of that decision. You are required to lodge your complaint with the Information Commissioner's office within 60 days of receiving this notice.

A complaint to the Information Commissioner must –

- have attached to it a copy of this decision; and
- give an address in Australia.



COUNCIL MEETING: 19ST AUGUST 2016

REPORT BY CEO ON ACTIVITIES

1. Goldfields Money Ltd

The Shire has now signed a MOU with GM and are in the process of setting up bank accounts. The ATM will be here in approximately 3 weeks time and will be set up in the foyer. This means that banking hours will coincide with Shire hours. The office currently used by Community Development will be the new bank office. If demand warrants taking the ATM elsewhere in order to increase banking hours then this will be decided on its merits. Tracy Dixon will be trained by GM to handle the normal banking issues such as opening accounts and assisting with ATM transactions.

2. Bendigo Bank

We have advised Bendigo of developments and have thanked the Mukkinbudin branch for their efforts.

3. Post Office

The building has been handed over to an Estate Agent for sale and judging by the number of tradesmen that are arriving at the shire offices requesting keys to the Post Office, appears to indicate that there may be a few interested parties out there.

4. Norseman Airstrip

Jon Fry and I have had discussions with the Civil Group regarding the Shire's participation in the project and have reached the conclusion that we would be out of our depth in taking on any work directly related to the project. That is not to say that we cannot do any ancillary work such as road work leading into the work area.

The Civil Group have provided an experienced supervisor to assist Jon Fry in the initial stages. Trevor Scott, apart from owning and operating his own construction group, constructed the Bunbury airstrip out of a swamp, so is well qualified to get the project up and running. As a result of having some technical issues to resolve before completing tender documents the project is behind schedule, however our financiers are all relaxed about the change in milestone dates.

5. Kate Mills

Kate is handling all our grant application work and spent a very worthwhile day in Norseman giving us updates on funding applications for the Woodlands Centre project, the approach to be followed with Lottery West applications for the Woodland Trails, relocating the youth centre and the Eucla Community Centre. Our initial plan was to do a repair job on the existing building, but we have been advised that we would stand a good chance of funding a new unit. In all these proposed applications we will be looking for multiple sources of funding in order to reduce or eliminate any calls on Shire resources. This is the main reason why we have engaged a professional; we are usually able to get funding to cover related professional costs.

6. Relocation of the CRC

The relocation of the CRC to the old ANZ bank building is now complete and is operating satisfactorily. In addition to the new building our new trainee is finding his feet and I believe will grow his confidence and new skills very quickly.

Angela is hosting a morning BBQ to celebrate the opening of the "new" CRC later in the month.

7. The Shire recently received a complaint about the state of both male and female ablution blocks at Balladonia. Our Health Officer reports that the owners (the Prendiville Group) will be erecting new facilities shortly.
8. The process to get approval for the partial closure of the Old Eyre Highway is continuing slowly, but should be completed in due course.
9. Staff Meetings
Councillors may not be aware that regular meetings are held with all inside staff plus Peter Ladewig (as a representative of the outside staff). Meetings are held fortnightly starting at 7.30 am and last for about an hour. The issues that are discussed are all topical and input is received from all.
10. 10 Year Plans
Senior staff have held a preliminary meeting discussing our approach to this project. We have scheduled a follow up meeting for the end of the month.

Miscellaneous Licence 63/74

Norseman Gold are in the process of obtaining a miscellaneous licence to gain access to a mine site they intend to develop in the near future. The reason they need a licence is because the access crosses a lease owned by a different company

On deciding the positioning of the lease they had to consider

- The most direct and easiest route
- The timber reserve to the north
- The effect of traffic on the Old Coach Road (Heritage Trail)
- The effect of traffic on the Old Telegraph Road

The most direct and easiest route to the mine site is 5 km, the width of the miscellaneous licence is 70 metres. An application to put the road north of the Old Telegraph Road would have strong opposition from conservationists. To avoid crossing the Heritage Trail it would be necessary to travel 10 km to the mine site and the terrain would not be suitable for haulage trucks (road trains)

Norseman Gold have suggested the following proposal. Travelling east from the Coolgardie Esperance Hwy

- There would only be one entrance of the Coolgardie-Esperance Highway, this would be where Norseman Gold propose to put the road, the access to Old Telegraph Road would be blocked off and the appropriate signage to indicate this would be installed.
- 100 metres in there is a cleared area where traffic using Old Telegraph Road would turn left and onto the original Old Telegraph Road, in this cleared area there is enough room for vehicles to pull off and some interpretive signage could be put there. Signage on the haul road would indicate the road is private mining road and no public access
- Construct the road on the Miscellaneous Licence as near as practicable to the southern side this will make the road virtually invisible from the old Telegraph Road.
- On the approach to the Old Coach Road traffic on the haul road would be signs to indicate all traffic to stop and on the Old Telegraph Road there would be give way signs. On the Old Coach Road traffic would have priority and there would be two sets of cross road signs
- On the return journey it would be the same except where the Old Telegraph Road traffic joins the Haul Rd near the Coolgardie-Esperance Highway the junction would be a "T" junction and the Haul Rd would have priority
- All signage would conform with Main Roads Western Australia and would be at Norseman Golds cost

Overall the Shire will retain Old Telegraph Road in its entirety. A haul road will be put in alongside the Old Telegraph Road however visibility will be minimal. Crossing the Old Coach Road with the haul trucks will be minimal as production is anticipated as low. Traffic counts on the Old Telegraph

Road and Old Coach Road are very low. There is already a crossing of haul trucks on the Old Coach Road at the OK Decline and from my investigations the intersection has been accident free.

Considering the offer Norseman Gold has made with the fill material for the airstrip at no charge and the input it has to the rate revenue it would seem to be a good working relationship to allow them to construct the road as they have requested, there are maps showing the area and the alternatives.

Norseman Gold has also requested permission to use the "other" tin dam which is approximately 5 km ESE of Norseman. The reasons why they intend to use it are explained in the email. There does not appear to be any reason to reject the offer. A map is included to show its position.

Footpath Report

I did a desk top study on the lengths and types of footpaths in Norseman using data from Roman11. I then went into the field to assess the condition of the footpaths. Generally speaking the concrete and paved footpaths are in good condition, some cracking in the concrete footpaths but only minor. The asphalt footpaths are all in a poor state with a very limited life, to assess the footpaths on a priority of replacement would be preferable on a needs basis as the condition of them is hard to differentiate

The shire at present has a total of 23,015m of footpaths which 15,426m are of asphalt construction and in need of repair, the asphalt is showing signs of cracking, disturbances due to tree roots and edge break, the material is extremely fragile and needs replacing. Quite a lot of the footpaths are in a condition where litigation could become an issue. To replace all the asphalt footpaths would cost in the vicinity of \$2.5 million.

There are several ways of reducing costs and these can be achieved by reducing the number of footpaths by only having them on one side on low traffic areas (quite common on new subdivisions), not having them in low traffic areas or removing the asphalt and replacing with gravel. The other alternative is to inject more money per budget into footpath construction, \$100,000.00/year would take 25 years to complete the replacement of the asphalt footpaths by this time the state of the asphalt would be unacceptable

Gardeners

The gardeners have been occupied with weed spraying, planting new plants at the Town Hall, trimming trees and whipper snipping

Town Crew

Repaired a minor drainage problem on Mort Harslett Drive, started removing dead trees around Norseman. Completed the sand foundation with retaining walls at the Doctors House, finished of work on the Old Eyre Highway

Construction Crew

The Construction Crew are re sheeting the Hyden Rd and it is time to make the annual trip to Eucla, a date has not been set as there are still issues with the Aerodrome that need to be solved, an update will be given at the meeting.
