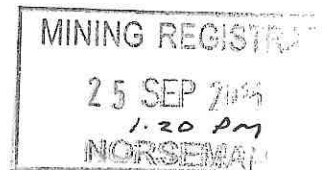

As discussed last week, please find attached a selection of maps to assist you and your fellow Shire of Dundas councillors. The plans were created using the WA Department of Mines and Petroleum's web-based TENGGRAPH Online system. I can easily generate new maps if you require additional information.

M63-657 Plan1

This plan depicts the granted mineral titles in **GREEN** outline and the pending/application mineral titles in **BLUE** outline.

M63-657 Plan2

This plan depicts Accent's new Mining Lease application (M63/657) in **ORANGE** fill.

M63-657 Plan3

This plan depicts Accent's existing twelve granted Prospecting Licence ('P') and Mining Lease ('M') mineral titles (P63/1380; 1381; 1383; 1384; 1642; 1893; 1904; M63/225; 226; 229; 247; 369) in **PINK** fill, and Accent's one other existing pending/application mineral title (P63/1997) in **RED** fill.

Notes to accompany all maps:

- The Shire of Dundas' heritage road/trail is shown as the **green dashed** double line which runs from near the top left of the plan, through Accent's tenure, and down to the bottom of the plan.
- The Shire of Dundas' heritage road/trail currently intersects/passes through seven of Accent's granted mineral titles (from north to south: M63/247; M63/225; P63/1893; P63/1904; M63/369; M63/226; P63/1383).

As you can see from these plans, Shire of Dundas' heritage road/trail already co-exists with Accent's granted mineral titles. The purpose of Accent applying for this new Mining Lease application (M63/657) over our existing mineral titles is not to prepare for imminent mining activities but rather to consolidate eleven (NOTE: M63/229 is not included within M63/657) of our smaller contiguous granted mineral titles into one consolidated mining title primarily for administrative as well as tenure retention reasons.

Matter for Consideration

To consider and, if thought appropriate, to lobby for the re-establishment of the WA Police Livestock Squad.

Background

The pastoral industry is one of the three main pillars of our local economy, and it is difficult to imagine that we could expect revitalisation of the local economy without a strong and profitable pastoral sector.

In fact, the Murchison Vermin Cell Project is aimed at doing just that. However, it is apparent that wild dogs are not the only threat to the pastoral industry, as we keep getting reports of livestock being stolen.

The Livestock Squad was a team of country police officers devoted to protecting and policing rural properties and farms across the state but it was disbanded in 2008.

With the benefit of hindsight, we can now see that this was not a good idea - it is no reflection on our local police, but the fact of the matter is that it is a specialised area of the law concerning livestock, and it is probably unfair to expect that general police would be sufficiently knowledgeable in the area of livestock law and livestock law enforcement.

Comment

The problem of livestock theft seems to be growing without any effective checks.

Earlier this year, South West MP Mick Murray also called for the reinstatement of the police stock squad. Mr Murray believed crimes committed in the country were not given the same level of attention as those in the city.

"I think the police do a fairly good job, but in saying that, if the stock squad was still around, I think that would probably stop some of these problems because it would be instantly there, not tied up with day-to-day issues," he said.

In June, more than 60 pastoralists attended a meeting in Leonora to talk about their growing concern about stock theft in the state's northern Goldfields.

Western Australia's Minister for Agriculture Hon. Ken Baston has not ruled out reforming the stock squad, and may well be a champion for this cause at the Cabinet table. He has said he would look into the legislation surrounding stock theft.

"Anything to do with stock theft is very much a specialist field and you can't expect everyone in the police force to actually understand animals because if they haven't got a farming background then it is difficult for them so that is something I very much need to look at," he said.

Statutory Environment

In 2013 the former Stock Act was absorbed under the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (BAM) Act. At least some pastoralists believe it watered down the powers of police.

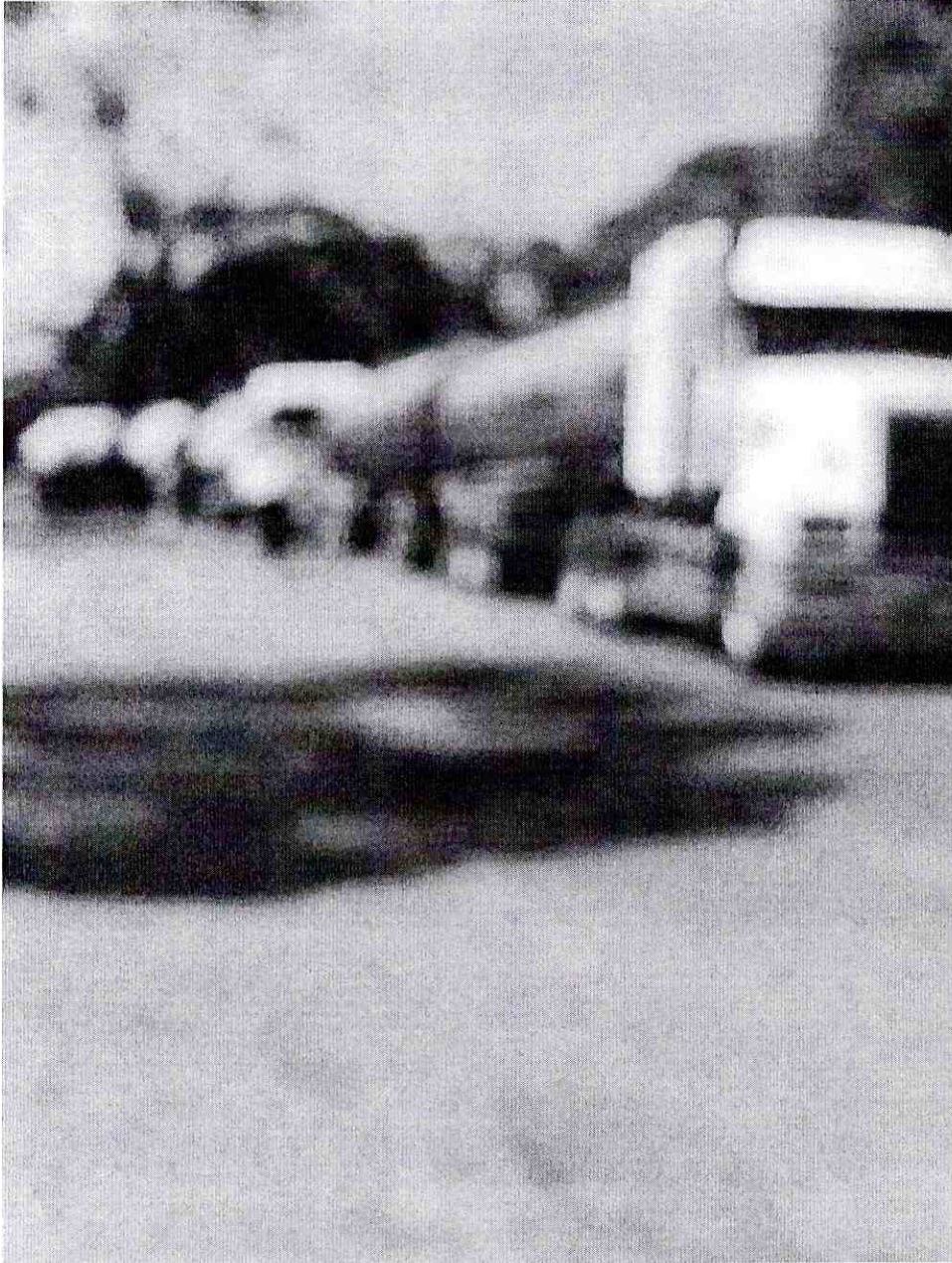

Hi Doug

Thank you for meeting me yesterday at very short notice and sharing my concerns.

The volume of water currently being drawn from the Norseman Standpipe is not sustainable as we are unable to replenish the system at the rate that water is being drawn. The standpipe was never designed to supply large quantities for commercial use. The standpipe was provided for

community purposes which includes firefighting and therefore water is charged at the Community tariff. I understand from time to time there may be ad-hoc requirements for other use.

Yesterday there were a couple of road trains filling up and the driver advised that the water was being taken to the Eyre Highway. I spoke to John Hollands and Lend Lease in an attempt to discuss my concerns with the main contractor, but both organisation advised that they had not engaged road trains to cart water.

As we were unable to establish who was taking the water, a decision was made to restrict the supply until it could be established who was using the water. Sonya was going to look at the system today and advise me.

The current situation is that with immediate effect I need to restrict the water taken from the standpipe to a maximum of 50kL per day, which will enable us to replenish our tanks within a week. If you need water for firefighting please take what you will need, but let me know asap.

Going forward I would like to discuss how best we operate the standpipe with minimal risk to the system.

Local authorities (LA) can apply to the Water Corporation for a standpipe. Where a standpipe is used for community purposes the Government provides a significant water use concession and therefore can only be used for community purposes. Where a local authority wishes to use or supply water for non-community purposes the LA would need to purchase a separate standpipe and commercial water charges would apply.

The water charge for local authority standpipe in Norseman is based on it being used for community purposes.

In many country towns there is a limited on the volume of water that can be supplied and restrictions on usage are put in place. Customers that require access to large volumes of water are supplied under a Water Supply Agreement.

A Water Supply Agreement provides for a daily entitlement based on the volume required.

As a guide I have provided below an indication of the charges that would apply for a daily entitlement to draw up to 49kL per day.

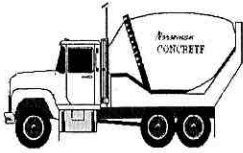

Contacted CY O'Conner Ranger Trainers for advice.

Was advised that 3 options available:

- To leave the injured dog with caretaker owners if they refused to hand the dog over and to advise them to contact ranger asap to discuss the situation
- Caretaker Owner to hand dog over to ranger as they were hindering an investigation. Ranger entitled to destroy dog.
- Get a warrant from JP and get police to seize dog.

Care taker owner refused to hand dog over. Advised to monitor dog, check drinking and eating and to keep wound clean

Two days later dog was picked up again wandering in the streets and taken to the vet in Esperance. Dog currently in pound.

Owner of dog is Allen Graham, 2 John Street Norseman. Dog is currently not registered.

Infringements of \$400 issued.

2. 7.11.15

Dangerous dog taking interest in Animal Farm at Gold Fever festival. Dog returned to owner.

Mother of Owner undertook to ensure dog was locked up and secure.

Shortly thereafter dog was again at Animal Farm and once again returned to owners mother.

Dog was found back at the Animal Farm for a third time and impounded.

Infringements of \$2,000 issued

3. 9.11.15

Unregistered dog attack on another dog

Offences committed include

- Keeping more than prescribed number of dogs
- Dogs not wearing collar with registration details
- Dog in a place without consent
- Dog attack or chase causing physical injury
- Injured dog taken to vet.
- Owner of dogs admitted that her animal was responsible for the attack.
- Issued with order for dogs to be registered as Dangerous.
- Infringement notices totalled \$1,400.

4. 10.11.15

Nurse attacked by large Brindle dog while out walking her dogs on a leash

Nurse' dog severely injured.

Nurse taken to hospital with severe bites to ankles requiring stiches.

Discovered young boy at home alone and in distress over dog action

Ranger called police to assist with unsupervised youth and in detaining dog which was acting extremely aggressively.

Managed to locate mother who insisted that the dog be destroyed.

Dog destroyed immediately.

Various infringements totalling \$800 issued.

5. 12.11.15

Large dog roaming streets with no identification

Dog impounded and posters put up in town.

Dog has been returned home on numerous occasions; owner not following directions.

Dog impounded, will be kept for 7 days

Infringements totalling \$800 issued.
