Ranger Services

- Several dogs have been picked by staff and impounded, one dog not claimed. Kalgoorlie Dog Adoptions were contacted, and they were very happy to take the dog and foster for a short period before the dog is transferred to Perth to SAFE Perth.
- Shire has been very limited with Ranger capabilities for several weeks, with intermittent surveillance runs being conducted.
- Request to add \$5000 donation split between SAFE Perth and Kalgoorlie Dog Adoptions.

Animal Welfare

The Shire has in the past years had a ranging animal welfare issue with owners not caring or even abandoning dogs. As well as a feral cat issue.



With regards to the welfare of unwanted dogs in Norseman it has been a common practice of euthanising dogs that have not been rehomed within the required timeframe.

Many Shires around the country have also the same issue and have changed their perspective on what to do with unwanted dogs. As the years pass may animal welfare charities have been created and are very successful in the rehoming of unwanted dogs.

Over the last 2 years the MWS has attempted to assist in the rehoming as many dogs as possible, which to date totals 7 dogs that have ben rehomed out of Norseman which assists in the town dog population.

The main dog adoption agencies have been SAFE Perth and more recently Kalgoorlie Dog Adoptions. With SAFE receiving 6 dogs and KDA 1 dog.

Both agencies have advised that they are prepared to take whatever dogs that become available.

All dogs have now been fully adopted and have all been desexed and all vet requirements completed prior to adoption. This generally costs \$400-\$600 each and does get quite expensive for not-for-profit agencies.

The Shire in past had a \$5000 donation component in the budget for the RSPCA who sadly over the years failed to commit to any of the dog issue in Norseman. A proposal to assist these 2 animal welfare agencies by having budgeted funds of \$5000 or whatever council thinks is an appropriate donation amount and would also assist the town of Norseman and also show to the public that the Shire is not in the dark ages like some and looking after the Shires animal welfare.

Vaccine

People aged 30 and over are now eligible to book the COVID-19 vaccination. Residents are required to check their eligibility for a COVID-19 vaccination before to booking at the Norseman Hospital Clinic. To book residents

Travel restrictions

Currently there are no restrictions for travelling within Western Australia.

Remote Aboriginal communities are considered more vulnerable to COVID-19 than other members of the community. To help keep remote Aboriginal communities safe from COVID-19, there are strict travel restrictions in place. Tourists and travellers are not allowed to enter, unless the community has an exemption in place. All interstate travellers must have a G2G Pass to enter WA, and are permitted to enter WA subject to government ordered restrictions. The type of restriction is reliant on which state you are from or the state you have recently travelled through. Local Emergency Management Meeting & LEMA

The Shire of Dundas held the full Local Emergency Management Committee meeting on Wednesday 19 May 2021.

The Draft Shire of Dundas Emergency Management Arrangements (LEMA) 2021-2022 was presented and reviewed by the LEMC. Committee members are still submitting feedback, once this has been received and entered, the completed the draft LEMA will be advertised with an invitation for community comment, submissions are then considered and where appropriate included in the document.

Once endorsed by the Shire of Dundas Local Emergency Management Committee it will be presented to Councill for adoption at and OCM.

Discussions n the meeting included schedule of dates for 2021-2022, planning for a Norseman Airstrip Scenario to be conducted later in August-September 2021, helicopter support in the Goldfields Esperance region, Eucla airstrip review, people accessing pastoral leases without permission.

Work Health and Safety Systems Review

The Manager of Community Development attended the Introduction to the *Work Health and Safety Act 2020* seminar hosted by HWL Ebsworth Lawyers which will addressed the:

- key changes to the legislation;
- the employers and employees these changes will affect;
- penalties and insurance provisions; and
- steps the Shire can take to prepare to meet the new requirements.

As part of the Shire's steps to ensure we are prepared to meet our obligations to the new requirements senior officers have also been working with Core Business Australia to conduct a review of our Work Health and Safety management systems including our current documents, resources and practices as part of the Shire's commitment to improving operational processes and building a culture or work place safety and responsibility. The first stage of the review has addressed WHS Policies, Procedures, Forms and Checklists.

Shire of Dundas Community Grants Program

Community Development is currently reviewing the Shire's Community Grant Program. The Shire recognises that local not for profit organisations provide a variety of activities and programs that enrich the lives of residents and visitors to the Shire of Dundas. The Shire also recognises the impact COVID-19 has had on fundraising opportunities in 2020, and this impact continues into 2021. In light of this Council will be presented with an increase of the Community Grants budget in the 2021-2022 Budget.

The revised Community Grants program will be presented to Council at the July OCM once stakeholder consultation regarding the program has been completed.

Election Commitment Funding

The Shire has formally submitted the funding application of \$80,000 election commitments. The \$80,000 is a combination of the 3 small projects:

- 1. Norseman Arts/Murals- \$20,000
- 2. Dual Naming Project-\$20,000
- 3. Norseman Heritage Trail- \$40,000

The funding provides the Shire with opportunity to progress some items that have been on hold, and will increase the community and visitor engagement with Norseman. The detailed scope of the three projects is scheduled to be presented to council in September, and it is envisioned that all projects will be completed and implemented by 31st May 2022.
