In February 2020 the operation of the VC was handed over to the Shire of Dundas, who have since relocated this service to the Woodlands Centre.

During Dec 2019 our district was almost engulfed with bushfire that continued into 2020, followed up by the onset and prolonged risk of Covid-19 in our community. As a result, the AGM for the Association had been put on hold.
