#### Summary

For the Council to consider and approve the Annual Report for the financial year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June 2020 (as included in the papers relating) and to set the date for the Annual Electors Meeting.

#### Background

The Audited Annual Financial Report and Auditors Report were presented to the Council at its ordinary meeting held on 22nd February 2021 and the Council resolved the following:

#### **That the Council of the Shire of Dundas**

- 1. Accept the recommendation of the Audit Committee that the Audit Report for 2019/20 as included in the papers relating be accepted;**
- 2. Accept the Annual Financial Report for the financial year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June 2020 as included in the papers relating.**

#### Statutory Environment

The Local Government Act requires that the local government accept the Annual Report by the 31<sup>st</sup> December following the year subject to the audit report being available. If the audit report is not available to allow the local government to accept it by that date, then the annual report needs to be received within

two months of the audit report being received. Due to changes in the new Financial Standards introduced by the Office of the Auditor General there was a delay in receiving the Financial Statements causing subsequent delay in the Annual Report being adopted.

The Act also requires that a General Electors Meeting be held within 56 days of the local government accepting the annual report of the previous financial year.

#### **Key Events of the Year**

COVID-19 remains one of the most significant events for the Shire of Dundas, as it is in the rest of Australia and globally. Council, Shire staff and the whole Community worked to overcome the challenges the pandemic placed on health, business, and day to day living.

#### Governance

- Two Councillors were re-elected to the Council during the year, as well as a new Councillor CR Valma Schultz elected.
- Cr Laurene Bonza was re-appointed as the Shire President.
- The Shire of Dundas was the only local government in WA to have agenda items presented at the WALGA AGM.

#### Law, Order and Public Safety

- Norseman West Complex Bushfires greatly impacted the Shire of Dundas over December 2019-January 2020, closing the Eyre highway and access to Norseman.
- The Shire invested in portable CCTV cameras as a more flexible option to address hot spots of crime.
- Council continues to advocate for recognition of the impact Drought along the Eyre Highway, seeking Government support for pastoralists, local business and Community.

#### Education, Welfare and Community

- The Woodlands Cultural Community and Visitor Centre construction was completed, providing a taste of the art community hub in Norseman to be used by local residents and visitors to the town.

#### Culture and Tourism

- The Shire took on the running of the Norseman Visitor Centre, and with the completion of the Woodlands Centre saw the service move into the new facility.

### **Audit Report**

The Independent Audit Report identifies that the Shire of Dundas has completed the 2019/20 financial year in accordance with the appropriate legislation and regulations and that there are no material matters affecting the Shire's financial position. Furthermore, there are no items of statutory non-compliance raised.

### **Annual Financial Report**

The revenue of the council is derived from rates, fees, charges and grants. Council received operating grants of \$1,754,661 during the year to support service provisions and various projects. Revenue from the rates for the year was \$2,537,808.

During the year, Shire has incurred operating expenditure of \$3,180,261 excluding depreciation to provide various services to the community.

It is proposed to hold the General Electors Meeting on the 15<sup>th</sup> June prior to the June Ordinary Council meeting.
