Summary

Background

The Audited Annual Financial Report and Auditor's Report were presented to the Council at its ordinary meeting held on 26th April 2022 and the Council resolved the following:

That the Council of the Shire of Dundas

- 1. Accept the recommendation of the Audit Committee that the Audit Report for 2020/2021 as included in the papers relating be accepted;**
- 2. Accept the Annual Financial Report for the financial year ended 30th June 2021 as included in the papers relating.**

Statutory Environment

The Local Government Act requires that the local government accept the Annual Report by the 31st December following the year subject to the audit report being available. If the audit report is not available to allow the local government to accept it by that date, then the annual report needs to be received within two months of the audit report being received. Due to changes in the new Financial Standards introduced by the Office of the Auditor General there was a delay in receiving the Financial Statements causing subsequent delay in the Annual Report being adopted.

The Act also requires that a General Electors Meeting be held within 56 days of the local government accepting the annual report of the previous financial year.

Comment

Key Events of the Year

The impacts of COVID-19 increased across not only locally but across Australia and the world. A significant amount of time from the Shire President was spent supporting the local community and advocating for their needs. Senior officers invested considerable time in addressing the operational impacts to workforce, supply of products, project delivery as well as community health and wellbeing. Council, Shire staff and the whole Community worked to overcome the challenges the pandemic placed on day-to-day living, individual and community health, workforce, local business, industry and the economy.

Governance

- The Shire of Dundas Council continued to advocate for the small regional communities taking more WA to have agenda items presented at the WALGA AGM.
- Senior officers continued to review the Shire's existing policies and procedures to ensure transparency, compliance, and best practice guides the Shire's operations. Throughout the year 6 new policies were adopted by Council, 1 policy was rescinded.

Law, Order and Public Safety

- The Shire of Dundas Local Emergency Management Committee actioned a Pandemic response subcommittee which met regularly to address local needs, and to raise areas of concern to the Operational Area Support Group.
- The Shire invested in portable CCTV cameras as a more flexible option to address hot spots of crime.
- Council continues to advocate for recognition of the impact Drought along the Eyre Highway, seeking Government support for pastoralists, local business and Community.

Education, Welfare and Community

- After much consultation the work the Norseman Interagency Group were proud to present to Council for endorsement the Norseman Community Wellbeing Plan. The Norseman Community Wellbeing Plan was developed using best practice principles informed by professional expertise and the lived experience and goals of the local community. The Development Workshops were facilitated by the WA Mental Health Commission, coordinated by Hope Community Services and hosted by the Shire of Dundas in Norseman.
- The Shire continues to have a close and productive relationship with Norseman District High School, valuing the collaborative approach to address the needs of the Norseman children and young people.

Culture and Tourism

- The Woodlands Centre became a key service provider during the pandemic, providing support for tourists and residents to navigate the myriad and ever-changing state of emergency restrictions.
- Many cultural events were required to be held in different formats due to the restrictions of the pandemic.
