Summary

For the Council to consider a development application for the construction of a shed to be used for a tyre business on Lot 48 (82) Prinsep Street Norseman

Background

The Council has received a development application from Mr B.C Ramsay the new owner of the Post Office to erect a 120m² colorbond shed with a wall height of 3.4m to the rear of the Post Office lot.

The shed is to be clad in classic cream walls and roof with manor red trim and to be utilised as a shed/workshop for the sale and fitting of tyres.

The subject lot is 1012m² in area and zoned Town Centre pursuant to the Shire of Dundas Town Planning Scheme No 2 (TPS).

A tyre sales / repair business is not specifically identified in the TPS however is considered to fall within the category of a "service industry". Pursuant to the TPS a "service industry" is considered an "AA" use within the Town Centre zone meaning that the use is not permitted, however the Council may at its discretion, permit the use.

The restrictions to shed floor area and wall heights are addressed in the Residential Design Codes and the Town Planning Scheme.

Comment

The Council in the past has generally limited shed wall heights to 3.0m however this applies in the main to residential lots. In this instance the shed is located in the Town Centre on a commercial lot. On commercial lots the restrictions in height are limited in general to 2 stories and the proposal is not considered over height, notwithstanding that there is a residence on the Post Office Lot.

The Shire has a number of development standards and under the "appearance of buildings" the TPS stipulates that:

"As a minimum standard the facades of commercial buildings shall be constructed of masonry stone, concrete, glass or a combination of these materials as approved by the Council."

The Council has the discretion to modify the standards however they must be satisfied that:

- Approval of the proposed development would be consistent with the orderly and proper planning
 of the locality and the preservation of the amenity of the area;
- The non-compliance will not have any adverse effect upon the users of the development or the inhabitants of the locality or upon the likely future development of the locality; and
- The spirit and purpose of the requirement or standard will not be unreasonably departed from thereby.

The existing Post Office building has considerable historical significance and is located on a prominent entrance into the commercial centre of Norseman. The Post Office is listed on the State Register (No 767) and classified by the National Trust as well as being included in the Shire of Dundas Municipal Heritage Inventory. As such any changes proposed to the building or building curtilage needs to be referred to the State Heritage Office for comment.

The Council may determine the number of car parking spaces to be provided on the land having regard to:

- the nature of the proposed development;
- the number of employees;

- the prevention or obstruction of roads and streets; and
- the orderly and proper planning of the locality and the preservation of the amenity.

Notwithstanding the above, the Council may waive a requirement for parking on a site if it is satisfied that adequate constructed car parking is available in close proximity to the proposed development.

Town centre development policies within the Norseman town site are:

- To encourage a high standard of development of commercial facilities in the commercial zone to service the requirements of the town, the rural hinterland and the travelling public;
- To encourage the development of commercial facilities associated with the tourist industry; and
- To encourage a better standard of building development.

The Councils current plans are to develop the precinct for tourism and cultural purposes, the proposal does not appear to be consistent with the Councils objectives for the area.

Whilst tourists do utilise tyre repair services, this type of business is not considered a significant part of the tourist industry which is generally associated with tourist information, attractions or a destination which the Shire is trying to encourage.

This is particularly the case for the corner of Prinsep Street and Ramsay Street, as it is the main entry into the commercial/shopping area with significant and historical buildings on 3 corners of the intersection (the town hall, the old shire office and the post office) as well as the much visited and well recognised and photographed camel roundabout.

However the following is also pertinent:

- The Town Planning Scheme No 2 considers that the proposed business would fall within the category of a "service industry"
- A 'Service Industry" is considered to be an "AA" use within the Town Centre zone", meaning that the use is not permitted'
- However the Council may at its discretion, permit the use.
