BIRD STUDIES

Activities include bird banding, regular bird counts in the mallee and a weekly count of shore birds and seabirds on Kanidal Beach

COURSES

The observatory offers courses which vary from year to year. Topics have included birds, mammals, reptiles, plants, photography, history, music, stargazing and art. Special effort has also gone into the stabilisation of nearby dunes. This work is being carried out regularly.

ACTIVITIES AT EYRE

The area is dense mallee, separated from the Southern Ocean by towering white sand dunes. There are plenty of outdoor activities for visitors to pursue including birdwatching, bushwalking, beach-combing, photography and painting. Visitors may wish to participate in studies conducted at the observatory. We recommend overnight stays. Day visitors with their own transport (4WD) are welcome.

THE BUILDING

The observatory is situated in the heritage-listed Eyre Telegraph Statior (built 1897). The Eyre Telegraph Station was abandoned in 1927. In 1977 the building was restored and became Australia's first bird observatory and has been operating as a bird observatory since then.
